



# 10 QUEEN ELIZABETH PARK LOOP

**VANCOUVER** Bikeways, quiet shared roads 20km loop

This route follows five Vancouver Greenways: Seaside, Cypress, Arbutus, Ridgeway, and Ontario. Queen Elizabeth Park is the highest spot in the city. Once a rock quarry, the park is famous for city views, Quarry Gardens, Bloedel Conservatory, fountains, and art. The most famous sculptures are *Knife Edge* by Henry Moore and *Photo Session* by Seward Johnson Jr.

**START** at Science World-Main Street Skytrain - Vancouver

**1 WEST** on Seaside Greenway along False Creek, \*Granville Island, Vanier Park

**2 LEFT/S** Cypress Bikeway


**3** At 6th **RIGHT/W** on Arbutus Greenway

**4 LEFT/E** 37th - Ridgeway Greenway - art on route, \*VanDusen Garden

**5 \*QUEEN ELIZABETH PARK 3km:**

Just past 37th & Columbia **LEFT** enter park, **NORTH** on path to Reservoir Garden - Bloedel Conservatory, Dancing Waters Fountain, Henry Moore sculpture **WEST** down path \*explore park trails, Quarry Garden, **EAST** on road, emerge on Ontario

**6 LEFT/N** Ontario Bikeway, **RIGHT/E** Seaside back to start
